Telerehab Trial

The large majority of patients with stroke do not receive acute reperfusion therapies, or receive them and are not helped by them, or have hemorrhagic stroke. New therapies are needed to improve outcomes in this population. Telehealth holds great promise in this regard. This study will provide substantial insights into the utility of a telehealth-based
